Casella Winery Excursion

Last week students from our HSC Business Studies class were fortunate enough to experience a comprehensive tour of the full operational processes of Casella Family Brands Winery, located at Yenda. As part of their core topics, students are expected to use actual business case studies when communicating their understanding of course content. Particular attention was given to their operations, marketing and human resource functions. Additionally, students must be able to understand how Australian business operate in the global market. Therefore, the excursion gave the students the opportunity to experience first-hand how businesses operate efficiently and productively to ensure they meet business goals and objectives. The tour involved going back to the original winery and family homestead, where operations first started in 1965. Today, the business employs nearly 800 people and operates 24 hours, 5 days a week and exports to over 40 countries. All 15 students were able to walk away from the excursion with a better understanding of how big businesses operate in the global business environment.
