## Year 11 & 12 Assessment Tasks

A reminder for students and parents:

- Parents must phone school to let staff know if a student will be absent on the day an Assessment Task is due. Students must have a valid reason for not being present on the day.
- Students who know they will be absent on the day of an in class Assessment Task (for example, representing the school in sport, cultural activities, etc.) must inform their teacher before the day of the task.
- All Assessment Tasks (assignments) must be handed in by 8:50am
- Students must be present all day when they have an in class Assessment Task. Students cannot sign in late in the period before an Assessment Task.
- Students who have missed an Assessment Task with a valid reason have two days to complete the yellow Assessment Adjustment Form and return this, with appropriate documentation such as a doctor's certificate, to Mr Gunter.
- Students who do not follow Assessment Procedures (as set out in the Assessment Booklet that all students were given a copy of), will receive zero for the task and receive an N Determination Warning Letter.

#### **School Uniform**



#### **P&C News**


- Our **P&C meeting** is held tonight, Monday 17 June 2019, 7:30pm in the Ted Drake Room, everyone welcome.

#### Leave Passes

■ If your child has to leave school during the day, you must send them in with a signed note clearly stating the child's name, year, roll group, times of departure and expected return and reason for the absence, approved leave is for medical, dental and legal appointments. This note must then be handed in at the office before school. The leave pass is then collected <u>before</u> going to the appointment. This is proof that your child has permission to be out of school.

■ When the student <u>returns</u> to school, they must take the leave pass back to the office so that their time of return can be recorded and they can be admitted back to class.

■ On **sports days** [Thursdays] students who are unable to attend sport due to illness must bring a note to the front office stating their injury and they will be supervised in the library during sport time.

# RMS Safer Diver Course

NDE Australia are currently conducting the Roads & Maritime Service (RMS) Safer Driver Course in Wagga Wagga, for Learner Drivers. The next course will be held at the Wagga Wagga RSL, Dodds Street Wagga Wagga, on Sunday 23 June 2019, commencing at 9:00am.

The course consists of a 3 hour theory session followed by a 2 hour practical driving session, which involves low risk driving techniques. The 2 hour session entails 2 students, completing a 1 hour drive each, on a pre prepared route.

The course provides 20 hours of log time in the Learner Drivers Handbook for \$140. Drivers need to have 50 log book hours to qualify for the course. This is great value for students and families and can be completed in 1 day. Lunch is provided at the training venue.

The Facilitators and coaches are highly skilled and experienced and provide easy to understand instructions, which will assist young drivers to gain valuable experience and safe driving techniques.
