Bus Marshal Services at Lutheran Interchange

Below is a statement issued by Department of Transport NSW outlining the plans to now have qualified supervision at the bus stop adjacent to Lutheran Primary School. This comes after recent misbehaviour by a number of students who utilise this stop, including some from Wagga Wagga High.

As you may be aware, some Wagga Wagga High School students traveling on bus services to and from school interchange at the Lutheran Primary School.

I am writing to you to let you know that from 23 September 2019 Transport for NSW has engaged a bus marshal to supervise students between 8 am and 9:30 am and from 2:30pm to 4 pm on school days at Lutheran Primary School, Wagga Wagga.

PGC Security has been engaged to provide these services, and the bus marshal is a qualified security guard with valid Working with Children Check.

The bus marshal will:

- monitor play activities, ensuring children do not enter the roadway or driveway
- direct children to wait in an orderly manner, on the bus stop seating, standing kerbside or on the verge adjacent to the bus stop
- coordinate bus boarding in a safe manner, ensuring that children not boarding a waiting bus are at a safe distance from the immediate boarding area and
- take day to day direction from the Principal of Lutheran Primary, for example in relation to students accessing the school grounds without permission.

The bus marshal is not responsible for:

- management of children's behaviour and/or language
- ensuring children catch the correct bus
- supervising children who are not waiting for a bus
- behaviour/safety of Lutheran Primary School students waiting on the school grounds (away from the interchange location) for their bus to arrive.

This is a temporary measure while Transport for NSW works through alterative permanent arrangements to minimise reliance on the current bus interchange at Lutheran Primary School. Transport for NSW anticipates a solution being implemented during the first half of 2020.
