# **Biology Excursion**



On Wednesday 4 March, the year 11 biology classes headed off to Lake Illawarra for a field study about marine ecosystems. During the excursion, the students learned about the importance of Neptune's Necklace (a type of green algae) and how it holds the ecosystem

together.

They measured the abundance of Neptune's Necklace on the rocky platform at Windang Island, whilst it was pouring with rain. Although the rain soaked everyone, it did not dampen the students' enthusiasm towards the field work - all students were excellently behaved and were a credit to Wagga Wagga High School.


