School Sport

With the return to full time onsite learning, School Sport will resume this Thursday the 28 of May for students in Years 7-10. In line with the NSW DoE guidelines, sport will occur as the following:

Sport for Years 7 and 8: Periods 1 and 2 Students in Years 7 and 8 will have sport during Period 1 and 2, attend their normal timetabled lessons Period 3-6 and will complete their normal timetabled Period 1 and 2 lesson, during Period 7 and 8.

Sport for Years 9 and 10: Periods 7 and 8 Students in Years 9 and 10 will follow their normal timetabled lessons and will participate in sport during Period 7 and 8.

Sport selections are available on the student portal. Students are to make their selection as soon as possible.

- Students remain in this sport for the remainder of Term 2. - Students who are injured are to bring in a signed note and they will attend sick and injured during sport.

Students and staff must follow the guidelines during sport.

Personal safety and hygiene. Students are to wash their hands before and after physical activity. Hand sanitiser will be available and equipment will be regularly cleaned/sanitised.
No water bottles and personal equipment is to be shared.
If students are unwell they are not to participate. It is expected that they stay at home, or a parent/carer will collect them if they turn unwell during the day. We look forward to seeing all students in their sports uniform this Thursday.

Year 10 Vaccinations

Students in Year 10 are due to get their Meningococcal vaccination Friday 7 August. For those students who have not already returned the consent card, please collect one from the front office.

School Uniforms

Students who are timetabled for practical lessons in PE, Recreation or PASS can wear their sport uniform all day as students are not able to access change rooms under current COVID restrictions put in place by the Department of Education. If students have a practical lesson subject on the same day in areas such as TAS (eg. Wood Technology, Food Technology, Textiles, etc.) students must wear leather shoes. They may need to bring their leather shoes in their school bag. If any families are experiencing financial difficulties in relation to purchasing winter uniforms, please contact a Deputy Principal or the students Year Adviser for assistance.

RMS Safer Driver Course

NDE Australia are currently conducting the Roads & Maritime Service (RMS) Safer Driver Course in Wagga Wagga, for Learner Drivers. The next course will be held at the St Johns Anglican Church Meeting Rooms, 6 Church Street Wagga Wagga, on Sunday 31 May 2020, commencing at 9:00am.

All social distancing procedures will be followed and hand sanitiser will be provided. The Safer Drivers Course is an essential service under the present COVID 19 situation and can be conducted under the present Government guidelines. Students are advised not to attend if they have any COVID 19 symptoms and can rebook for a later course.

The course consists of a 3 hour theory session followed by a 2 hour practical driving session, which involves low risk driving techniques. The 2 hour session entails 2 students, completing 1 hour drive each, on a pre prepared route. The course provides 20 hours of log time in the Learner Drivers Handbook for \$140. Drivers need to have 50 log book hours to qualify for the course. This is great value for students and families and can be completed in 1 day. Lunch is provided at the training venue. The Facilitators and coaches are highly skilled and experienced and provide easy to understand instruction, which will assist young drivers to gain valuable experience and safe driving techniques.
