Year 7 Immunisations

The second round of year 7 Immunisations will occur this Thursday 7 October. Please ensure that you are well hydrated and eat a good breakfast. Catch up needles will also occur on this day for students who were absent on the first occasion. All consent cards were issued and signed by parents/caregivers at the beginning of the year and are held by the Immunisation nurses following their first dose in March this year.

Covid-19 Update

As we return to school for Term 4 we continue with the same Covid restrictions in place as we ended Term 3. The wearing of masks is mandatory indoors and recommended for outdoors, unless the student is eating/drinking or actively participating in Sport. Students are required to bring their own mask. If you are unable to wear a mask (for medical reasons) you must provide the school with documentation from a medical practitioner. The same timetable will run as per Week 10 of Term 3 with staggered recesses and lunch times. Roll call will take place in Period 1 classes. When arriving at school, please move to your assigned area to reduce mingling between years; Year 7 & 8 - Lower Amphitheatre or active area; Year 9 & 10 - Upper Amphitheatre or active area; Year 11 & 12 - Top Quad, Senior Lawns or active area. Alternative arrangements are in place for Sport on Thursday. Parents/Caregivers and students will be updated if and when there are any changes to these arrangements.
